

Telephone Demonstration

ACTT: Assisting Consumers Through Technology

ACTT provides telephone demonstrations for the Missouri Telecommunications Access or TAP program, which provides free adaptive telephones for people who cannot use a traditional phone due to a disability, such as hearing loss, vision loss, and memory loss or mobility limitations. ACTT staff can assist in trying different phones to determine the best option and completing the state TAP application.

Missouri Telecommunications Access Program (TAP) & Internet Program (TAP-I)

Missouri offers the Internet or TAP-I program, which provides free adaptive computer equipment (hardware and software) to people whose disability prevents them from accessing information on the internet. Equipment includes magnification software, adaptive keyboards and pointing devices, and speech recognition software.

You may qualify for TAP and TAP-I Programs!

- Be a resident of Missouri
- Be unable to use a traditional phone due to a disability—TAP
- or Be unable to use a computer to access the internet due to a disability—TAP-I
- Have basic land line phone service—TAP
- Or Have a computer with internet service—TAP-I
- Have an annual adjusted gross income of \$60,000 or less per year for a household of 1 or 2. Larger households add \$5,000 per year, per additional dependent.

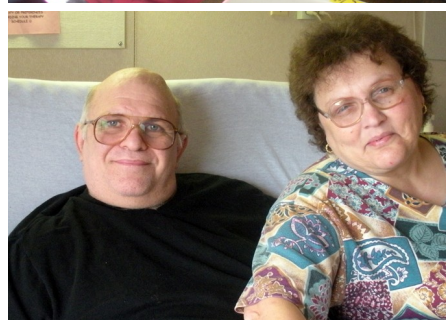
